**II. 4 Our Children, 4 Our Teachers, 4 Our Safety, 4 Our Future**

Wayne Gent presented on the School District's proposed referendum election to approve levying \$1 million for teachers, safety, mental health, and operational needs in the schools (see attached). Cost per household would be \$14.00 per month.

**V. Chair Report/Executive Director Report**

Executive Director Report

Teresa Bishop presented the Executive Director Report (see attached). She requested approval to apply for three grants:

- Alleghany Franciscan Ministries – RTVYI - \$75,000 (one year)
- Roy Hunt Foundation – RTVYI - \$50,000 (over two years)
- Strategic Prevention Framework – Partnership for Success - \$300,000/year for five years

She also requested up to \$5,000 in reserves for a grant writer for the Federal grant.

***Motion was made by Wydee’a Wilson to approve submitting the three grants and a grant writer, seconded by Linda Bartz. Motion carried unanimously.***

**VI. Youth Leadership Mental Health PSA**

Kevin Singletary presented the Mental Health PSA that Youth Leadership wrote and acted in. Teresa Bishop thanked the St. Lucie County Commission for approving a grant the Youth Leadership wrote to do the PSA.

**VII. Spotlight on Communities Connected for Kids**

Carol DeLoach presented on Communities Connected for Kids and all of the things they do for the child welfare system (see attached). In 2013 they were awarded a five-year contract by the state for oversight of Circuit 19, and were tasked with developing, managing and overseeing the system of care. They are responsible for providing foster care and related services for every known abused, neglected or abandoned child in Indian River, Martin, Okeechobee, and St. Lucie counties. Services include family preservation services, independent living, foster care supervision, case management, adoption and family reunification, and a continuum of placement services.
