**I. Welcome**

Linda Hudson welcomed all members and guests.

**II. November Agenda & October Minutes**

### Executive Director Report

Teresa Bishop congratulated Linda Bartz and Mayor Hudson on the recent vote. She thanked Wydee'a Wilson for her time on the Roundtable and wish for the best in her new position. She then presented the Executive Director Report (see attached).

## **VI. Ignite Youth Alliance Quarterly Update**

Monica Jakobsen presented the update for Ignite (see attached). She noted that 12 clients graduated from high school this year, and thanked the Outreach Workers for their hard work. Pro-social skills are slipping due to Covid and transportation issues. She is looking into perhaps purchasing a van. Wydee'a Wilson stated that DJJ may be able to help in this. There is an increase in violence by 8-11 year olds, and they are working closely with law enforcement. This is a problem from Brevard to Miami. Teresa Bishop noted that mental illness and trauma are being criminalized. There are no available effective treatment options. Treasure Coast Hospice is looking at models. Dr. Prince noted that they have hired additional social workers. Covid greatly impacted the black community. They are not able to access the services that are available. Wydee'a Wilson added that statewide they are evaluating the residential commitment program and why it isn't working.

## **VII. Announcements/Agency Updates**

- Andy Treadwell – IRSC will be holding a groundbreaking ceremony for their new Advanced Workforce Training Complex on December 4<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 p.m. The facility will link advanced technology and industry training in specialized technical career fields such as advanced manufacturing, automotive, aviation and marine technology; welding; heating, and ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) systems.
- Jon Prince – 55% of students are attending brick and mortar school, with zero Covid cases. They have produced a Covid dashboard so that families can see if there are any cases at their specific school.
